



Steps to Share your Faith

You can refer to these steps as you share the gospel. Remember, this is a simple guide and template. You can expand on this as you grow in your evangelism. The more you witness, the more comfortable you will feel, and the more you will be able to expound and adapt this to your own personal style.

Step 1: Hand out a gospel tract.

- Say: " Did you get one? ""Here is a gift for you", "Here you go", "Enjoy the game"

Step 2: Transition into the 10 Commandments. (Exodus 20:1-17)

- Ask: "If you died today would you go to heaven or hell?"
- Then, ask, Why? (they will most likely tell you why they are a good person)
- Next, ask, "Do you consider yourself to be good person?" or "Do you think you are good enough to get to Heaven?"

Step 3: Go through the Commandments by asking them if they have kept them.

- Say: "Let's see how good (or bad) you really are." (Luke 18:18-20)
 - a. "Have you ever told a lie?"
 - b. "Have you ever stolen anything?"
 - c. "Jesus said if you hate someone you have murdered them in your heart and if you lust after a person you have committed adultery in your heart."
 - d. "Have you ever taken God's name in vain?"

Step 4: Explain God's judgment. (Acts 17:31)

- Ask: "If God judged you by the 10 commandments would you be innocent or guilty?"
- Then ask: "Being guilty, would you go to heaven or hell?"
- If the person thinks they are still good enough to make it heaven, use the analogy of the courtroom. Continue to explain that in the same way that criminals deserve punishment, liars, thieves and adulterers also deserve God's punishment because he is just and holy.

Step 5: Share the Gospel.

- Explain the sacrifice of Christ for sinners. (Romans 5:8)
- Explain his death, burial and resurrection. (1 Cor. 15:4)
- Explain that they must be born again. (John 3:3-8, Ezekiel 36:25-27)
- Explain that they must repent of their sins and put their faith in Jesus. (Acts 20:21)
- Give them a Bible, direct them to a church, and take down their information to help them as needed.
